Score	Short Description	Long Description
5	Perfect	Solution is correct and thorough. Reasoning is clear and sound. Notation and terminology are correct.
4.5	Close	Essentially correct. One (maybe two) minor (non-calculus) mistakes, small gaps, or notational issues. Shows a solid understanding of how to solve the problem.
4	Roughly Correct	Correct approach, mostly carried out correctly. No major conceptual errors. There may be several small errors/gaps or one significant error/gap.
3.5	Significant Progress	Either incomplete or incorrect, but, overall, more right than wrong. For example, student starts solving the problem correctly, gets at least halfway through, but does not finish solving the problem.
3	Some Progress	Progress towards solution, but more wrong than right.
2	Relevant Work	No progress towards solution, but contains some relevant information (that was not included in the problem).
1	Effort	No relevant information, but the problem was attempted.
